LABOR MARKET INFORMATION

What is labor market information and why should a business use it?

Labor market information (LMI) includes data about employment levels, unemployment rates, wages & earnings, employment projections, jobs, training resources and careers. It can help you recruit qualified workers, develop job descriptions, obtain affirmative action data, learn about wages in your area and make sound economic decisions.

The Ohio Labor Market Information Training Institute offers workshops that help business professionals understand and use labor market information effectively.

LABOR MARKET INFO FAVORITES

The monthly **Labor Market Review** includes current and historical data on employment by industry, hours and earnings for Ohio and twelve metropolitan areas; civilian labor force estimates of employment and unemployment; selected unemployment compensation data; explanatory and analytical articles; and technical notes. Seasonally adjusted employment estimates, by industry, are included for Ohio. Seasonally adjusted labor force estimates are available for Ohio and the United States. <http://lmi.state.oh.us/ces/lmr.htm>
